Biblical Reflections

On Readings of Next Sunday **Third Sunday in Ordinary Time** **January 22nd, 2012**

Mark's Gospel (Mark 1:14-20) for next week sets the stage for the beginning of Jesus' ministry which proclaims the Gospel of God and the coming of His Kingdom. The opening of the reading hints that as Jesus follows John the Baptist in ministry, so He will follow John in death.

The Kingdom first comes upon the unsuspecting fishermen as Jesus begins to call His first chosen apostles. Jesus, being the Son of God along with His awesome purpose greatly impresses those first called, Simon and Andrew and James and John. They, without hesitation, drop what they are doing to follow Jesus eagerly hungering to hear more. It costs them everything, their livelihood as well as family. Jesus' words surely rang with much zeal, strength and excitement with lofty expectations. The men did not stop to consider the consequences of such a decision but gave Jesus their allegiance and followed Him. While preaching about the Kingdom of God and the necessary conversion, Jesus won their hearts. By this we can see how powerful and direct Jesus' call to share in the mission must have been. Therefore all of them began their exciting yet tension-filled journey which ultimately led to Jesus' sacrifice on the cross.

In Mark's words the message to "come after" Jesus meant to join in His powerful mission and to walk the journey of life-giving exhilaration while at the same time also draining confusion as well as fear. On this road to the Kingdom the apostles were also led to sainthood and everlasting happiness in Heaven. What a road they traveled!

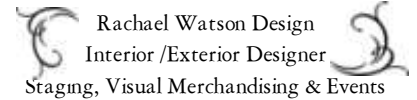
