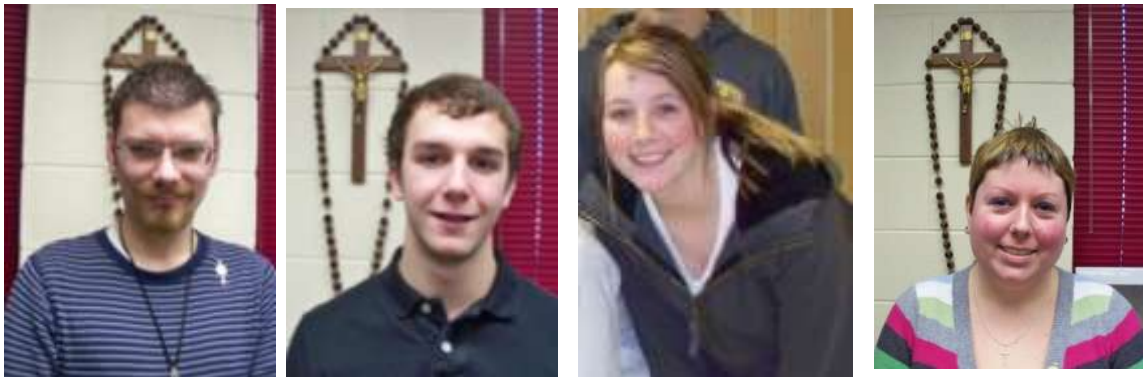

Rite of Election

The Rite of Election closes the Period of the Catechumenate. This rite normally coincides with the First Sunday in Lent. At this rite, upon the testimony of sponsors and catechists and the catechumens' affirmation of their intention to join the Church, the Church makes its "election" of these catechumens to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. In the presence of the bishop (or his delegate), they inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect at the cathedral as a pledge of fidelity. Now the catechumens are called "the elect" or "the illuminandi" ("those who will be enlightened"). They now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment – the final, intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. On the next five Sundays of Lent, three scrutinies (rites for self-searching and repentance) and the presentations of the Creed and Lord's Prayer take place. This period concludes with the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

On Sunday, March 4th, Mark White, Tom Porch and Josie Kibbe will participate in the Rite of Election in Springfield. Carrie White will receive her confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Please keep them in your prayers.

FROM THE OFFICE OF VOCATIONS

Opportunity for Young Men Discerning the Vocation of Priesthood to Visit the Seminary!

OPPORTUNITY FOR CHRISTIAN SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

Christian spiritual direction is a one-to-one relationship between a director and a directee (a person seeking to deepen their spiritual life). The specific aim of spiritual direction is to assist a person to grow more deeply in her/his relationship with God and with neighbor. The helping supportive relationship established between a director and directee assists the seeker or directee to move forward in his/her spiritual life. Persons seek spiritual direction, for example, when they are experiencing a new sense of God in their lives, when facing a change or transition in life, when involved in church ministry, when discerning an important decision in life, when experiencing discouragement, or when desiring to deepen their relationship with God. Sr. Charlotte Flarlong, SSND, pastoral associate at Our Lady of the Ozarks Parish, Forsyth, MO, has certification in spiritual direction from Aquinas Institute of Theology in St. Louis, MO and experience in offering spiritual direction and doing retreat work in the St. Louis Area. Sr. Charlotte moved to Forsyth, MO this past August and would like to offer her services as a spiritual director to men and women residing in the Springfield area. She is willing to spend a Tuesday a month in Springfield if there is interest. She would be able to meet with five or six individuals during that time. Biblical Reflections

On Readings of Next Sunday
2nd Sunday in Lent
March 4th, 2012

Next week Mark's Gospel (Mark 9:2-10) gives us the account of the transfiguration. It was just days after Jesus' first prediction of the Passion. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John with Him "up a high mountain" where He is revealed in all His glory. However, even these three privileged ones soon came down the mountain wondering about Jesus' words charging them not to reveal what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. Rising from the dead did not make much sense to them at this point.

Each part of the transfiguration adds something special to the story: the dazzling white garments suggest the presence of the Divine; the appearance of Moses and Elijah represents the law and the prophets of the Old Testament; and the voice in the cloud provides Divine validation of Jesus being the Son of God, while instructing all to listen to Jesus. When Peter, James, and John watched this beautiful scene unfolding they were awe-struck at the realization that Jesus is the fulfillment of the prophets (Elijah) and of all of the law (Moses). Peter seems to capture this consoling moment and wants to keep Jesus, Moses, and Elijah there with them.

Jesus, of course, knew that they all would have difficulty accepting the fact of His suffering and death before rising from the dead, so consequently, He tells them not to get themselves or others excited about the glory they had seen at the transfiguration until after He had risen from the dead.

FROM THE DESK OF THE CRE

What can I do different this Lent?

The first thing most of us think about is. "What am I going to give up for Lent?" but Lent is so much more. We are called to pray, fast and alms-giving. I could write about prayer, or about fasting but in this time I am going to write about alms-giving. We are called in the gospel of Matthew Chapter 6: 4 to give alms in secret so "And your Father who see in secret will repay you." What better way during Lent than to give to others who are less fortunate than you are. No matter how little we have, we have so much more than most people in other countries; Christ calls us to share what we have with others.

This Lent let us express our thanks for the many blessings in our lives. This Lent we are putting out Rice Bowls as a way for you to give in secret, no one will know if you give a box full on pennies or a box full of dollars. Catholic Relief Services serves in many countries overseas but did you know that 25% of all they take in stays in the United States. This is your opportunity to give so that the whole world benefits. One of the gifts you will be giving is the gift of fertile land and life-giving water. The organization does this with the installation of a simple treadle pump. When someone lives in a country without the benefit of running water, this pump makes a difference between a healthy and fruitful life and a life of suffering. Read about how this pump changed the life of Mr. Robin in the Operation Rice Bowl literature this week.

Make the Rice Bowl a part of the family Lenten celebration, each week highlights a different country, with prayer, reflections, the Stations of the Cross, and even a new native dish you can prepare for your family. Help the children or grandchildren to view life from a different perspective. Help them grow in their view of the world and their spiritual life by engaging them in Operation Rice Bowl this year. You can go online to orb.crs.org to download additional items to make this a fun and fruitful Lent.


In Matthew's gospel, Christ tells us "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me..." Remember when we serve others we serve Christ. When asked "What is the greatest commandment?" Jesus answered, "You shall love the Lord, your God with all you heart, with all your soul and all your mind. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." What a wonderful opportunity to help our fellow man. Let's all join together to make this a great Lent for ourselves and for others in Christ name.

Christ in Prayer: "They went to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." He took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be distressed and agitated." This is the prelude to his passion. Please pray for Christ to lead you this Lent.
