Biblical Reflections

On Readings of Next Sunday
4th Sunday in Lent
March 18th, 2012

The Gospel for next week (John 9:1- 41) taken from the Mass for the Second Scrutiny is the dramatic story of Jesus' healing of the man born blind. There is a large contrast between the accepting, loving attitude of the once blind man and the argumentative, condemning Pharisees who refuse to believe even the truth that is right before their own eyes. This story focuses on light, on Jesus as the Light of the world, a Light which can bring sight to the previously blind in spite of the blindness of those confident in their own sight, such as the Pharisees who turned away from the "True Light."

As we read about the washing of the blind man in a pool called Siloam which means "sent" John is writing in such a way that it reflects and calls to mind the cure of spiritual blindness granted to those who wash in the sacrament of Baptism. It is also not hard to imagine the wondrous effect received by those who were spiritually blind from birth.

This story is rich in irony. Those who are sure that they know all and can see, spiritually or otherwise, are in truth blind and are so by their own choosing. In the Gospel account the man who actually starts out blind in body, and spiritually takes a risk at Jesus' invitation leads to the rest of the story. The man ends up seeing by Jesus' hand. He passes from blindness to sight to insight. His cure is a sign. Jesus is indeed the Light of the world! All that Jesus asks us is that we see and believe. No one is as blind as the person who stubbornly refuses to see.

Catholic Charities of Southern Missouri is currently assisting survivors of the "Leap Day" tornadoes and storms which affected both the East and West sides of our Diocese. Multiple injuries and extensive damage to homes and businesses were reported across the region, displacing many families and leaving individuals without employment. Disaster Case Managers have been sent to Branson and Kimberling City to help families in Stone, Taney, and Barry Counties affected by the EF2 tornado. Assistance is also available for families needing help in Buffalo, Lebanon, and surrounding areas. On the East side of our diocese, Disaster Case Management offices are open in Van Buren, Sikeston, and Cape Girardeau to assist those affected by the severe storms.

Want to help? Temporary housing, non-perishable food items, and personal hygiene products are in critical need. Cash donations and gift cards, such as Wal-Mart and Visa gift cards, are preferred as these types of donations enable agencies to take advantage of bulk pricing on relief supplies. This 'n' That

This week, Father Joseph asked me to attend the morning meetings that are going on at the old Harter House building in regard with the tornado that hit our area on February 28. I am in awe of the work that this group of people are doing. Unfortunately, by the time I get to typing up my notes for the weekend bulletin, the events that are discussed at these morning meetings have already happened. However, here are some of the important items of interest:

- Most important on the list is the need for volunteers. I told them we don't have a lot of tree luggers (let's face it, we are an older group and we just can't carry tree trunks like we used to when we were younger), but they have all types of jobs that can be done, and are being done, by men and women in their 70's. If you have time for volunteer work, please go to the old Harter House building and register with them. They call you on an as-needed basis so you don't have to stand around all day waiting for them to give you something to do.
- Taney County can now text donations – we do not have this capability yet for Stone County.
- Pet Supplies for survivors' pets can be obtained at the Mayor's office and First Baptist Church.
- They have about 15 tarps that are available to those whose homes have been damaged so if you know anyone needing them, they need to go to the old Harter House building.
- Ozark Food Services has dropped off 14,000 pounds of food which is equivalent to feeding 250 families. This food can be picked up at the Christian Associates of Table Rock Lake Mobile Food Pantry for Stone County residents on March 22 from 10:00am until 12:00 noon. If you are a senior, seasonal worker or have students living in your home, you are eligible for Christian Associates mobile food pantry. Call 417-739-3200 to register you and your family.
- MODOT crews will be helping to chip trees and shrubs on DD starting Monday or Tuesday next week. Prisoners (who have good conduct records) will be helping to work at that site next week.
- Tri-Lakes Center in Branson is housing food supplies, personal hygiene products, cleaning supplies, food containers, etc. Jane Gallagher at Tri-Lakes is organizing everything that comes in.
- As I mentioned, I am in awe of the work being done by this group of men and women who are servicing our community. With this in mind, they are also looking for volunteers to be on a Long-Term Recovery Committee to be trained by experts from AmeriCorp. Please call me if you would like to be part of the Long-Term Recovery Team, 739-4700, ext. 11. Thank you!!
- I have also been in touch with Catholic Charities who have been very involved in this disaster recovery. They were here during the Food Pantry this past Wednesday, and they have had case workers here this past week. They have also informed me that they want to be included in the Long-Term Recovery Meetings to help those affected by the tornado in this area.

As noted at the top of this article, there are some things which have already happened before this information was made available to you. This bulletin is being typed on Friday, March 9th.

- Hill Billy Bowl Blue Grass show on Saturday nights – they are having a fundraiser this Saturday and the proceeds will go to the tornado disaster fund. As of Thursday, \$1,847 in donations has been received. Funds are being held by Christian Associates in a separate fund.
- Friday morning, March 10th, at 10:00am, a vegetative burn at a site on Hwy 13 and DD was started and was manned by members of Rubicon. The burn can be continued if we can get volunteers to supervise and man the burn at a later date. Right now, the permit is good for Friday and Saturday.

That's it for this week. I am keeping Father advised on a daily basis after attending the morning meetings, and we will keep you advised and informed as more information is given to us.

May the light of Christ shine in us, and may we set an example of faith and love in our community.
