## *Month of the Holy Eucharist*

When at his Last Supper Jesus said: “This is my body”, what he held in his hands had all the appearances of bread. However, the Church teaches that the underlying reality was changed in accordance with what Jesus said, that the “substance” of the bread was converted to that of his body. In other words, it actually was his body, while all the appearances open to the senses or to scientific investigation were still those of bread, exactly as before. The Church believes that the same change of the substance of bread and of the wine occurs at every Catholic Mass throughout the world.

# Biblical Reflections

*On Readings of Next Sunday*  
**Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**  
**April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012**

There are two Gospel choices for next Sunday (Gospels at the Procession Mark 11:1-10 and John 12:12-16). Besides this we will have the traditional Gospel of the Lord's Passion and death in detail (Mark 14:1-15:47).

Mark's account 11:1-10 tells of Mary (sister of Lazarus and Martha) anointing Jesus with precious and expensive oils. The ointment represents not only preparation for death, but a burial anointment which fills the house with fragrance. The next reading of John 12:12-19 shows Jesus entering Jerusalem one last time. This time He comes as King. Although victorious, Jesus does not ride a stallion of war as most kings but chose the donkey of service to ride that day. Jesus' gift of life to Lazarus by raising him from the dead is now going to demand a frightening change, His own life for that of His friend and those of the whole human race.

Finally, in the Passion narrative, Jesus' hour has come! We know this touching love story very well. Mark, however, leaves his readers with the startling realization that they have to conclude the Gospel by living out its values. It ends with the dramatic invitation for all the readers of the Gospel to be always faithful imitators of Jesus who has given us the ultimate example of true love and caring for others until He comes again to establish the reign of God in power (8:38 and 9:1) His horrible death on the cross was His ultimate act of self-giving and trust in His Father. Jesus firmly believes that God the Father will hear Him and will again give Him life precisely because He gave all that He had to give and suffered and died out of unconditional love and obedience.
